### Jonathan Woodroffe

Director and co-founder

Jonathan works freely between the disciplines of architecture and urban design and has over 19 years experience of working on large-scale urban and architectural projects. In particular, he has been recognized internationally for his urban visions and designs for regenerating inner city industrial sites and waterfront locations. In 1994 he won an international competition for the redevelopment of Riga's waterfront and subsequently advised the municipality in the selection of sites for the Riga's new Concert Hall. In 2005, he was director-in-charge responsible for making an urban vision for the "Antwerp Quays", a 6km long 60ha industrial site along the River Scheldt.

As an architect, Jonathan has been director-in-charge of several award-winning projects for S333. He was co-responsible for S333's first completed project, Schots 1+2 in Groningen, voted the Best Building in Groningen in 2003 and short listed for the 2003 Mies van der Rohe Awards for Contemporary Architecture. The project combines shops, apartments, parking, gardens and courtyards in two; mixed-use courtyard blocks in the centre of the city.

Most recently, he was director-in-charge of Block 7+9, a mixed use residential-led building in Rem Koolhaas's innovative, high profile masterplan for the centre of Almere. Other architects who have made buildings in the masterplan include Christian Portzampark, SANAA, OMA, SeARCH and David Chipperfield.

Jonathan is currently director-in-charge of a 240,000m<sup>2</sup> mixed use leisure project in Houston and a small, leisure park in Jeddah. He is also collaborating with local architects in Krasnodar on a range of waterfront developments in Sochi, in preparation for the 2014 Winter Olympics.

Previous to co-founding S333 Architecture + Urbanism, Jonathan worked for architects Neutlings Reidijk (Rotterdam), Wilkinson Eyre (London), The Architects Collaborative (Boston) and John Patience and Associates (Wellington). He has taught and lectured extensively at Schools of Architecture across Europe and is Chairman of YEA, a forum aimed at expanding possibilities for young architects who wish to work across European borders.

Dominic Papa has over 18 years experience on large-scale urban and architectural projects. Dominic works freely between the disciplines of architecture and urban design and brings to the practice skills in conceptual design, strategic urban thinking and detailed design. At S333 he has been the director in charge of a broad cross-section of projects, including large-scale residential led mixed use developments such as the award winning Schots 1&2 and Tarling Regeneration projects, as well as masterplans in Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway and the UK.

Currently he is directing the development of a 9 hectare sustainable urban quarter in Plymouth, a nursery school also in Plymouth, a residential project at Elephant and Castle and a mixed use scheme in the heart of Bloomsbury's conservation area; both in London. He is leading a research team exploring the contemporary conditions influencing the success and failure of intense forms of housing and urbanism in Britain. He is developing new initiatives in the Architecture of Innovation in Europe and the Far East.

Prior to S333 he worked with Farrell's and Company in London where he worked in the Company Development Group. Later he spent six years as Senior Design Associate with Wiel Arets Architects and Associates in the Netherlands.

He is a member of the RIBA Housing Group advising on policy and is a national design review panel member for CABE and a regional panel member for the West Midlands. He has judged a number of international awards and competitions and has contributed to TV debates in the UK, Netherlands and New Zealand. He has been visiting tutor at the graduate programme Housing and Urbanism at the Architectural Association in London since 2001 where he has also been liaising on developments in Mexico, Shanghai and Hanoi.
